



Welcome to the 2019 Women of Achievement Lunch

This is the twelfth Women of Achievement Lunch in London and I am delighted to welcome you all here today. The lunch was established to celebrate the achievements and contribution made in many fields by women who have Scottish connections and to support small, but vital Scottish charities. Thank you to all of you who have supported the lunch over the years and welcome to those joining us for the first time.

Last year we supported Smart Works in Edinburgh and thanks to you all, we raised over £20,000 which went directly to the charity enabling them to support women on low incomes to get back into employment, empowering them to succeed at their job interview and change the direction of their lives.

This year's charity is Richmond's Hope. A tiny, but amazing charity, which I have been privileged to have got to know over the last couple of years. Started by the Rev. Liz Henderson, the charity is the leading provider of child bereavement support in Glasgow and Edinburgh and, with our help, will be able to extend the reach to further parts of Scotland.


One child in every class at school will lose a significant member of their family and without the right support the chances of this clouding their adult life is immense. Young bereaved people have statistically been shown to be more likely to self-harm, suffer from depression or contemplate suicide. The percentage of prisoners who have suffered a major bereavement in childhood at Polmont Young Offenders is 90% and Richmond's Hope works to help children and young people to work through their grief and develop coping strategies for the future.

I have visited both centres and the work that Richmond's Hope does is truly wonderful, working both with children and Teenagers, as well as working with the families affected. The counselling rooms are well thought out, the staff inspirational and where the children are allowed to be children despite all that they might be going through.

Our speakers this year are Rev. Liz Henderson (Founder of Richmond's Hope), Dame Penelope Keith and Cath Kidston.

My particular thanks go to the Committee who have worked so hard and given willingly of their time and talents to make this lunch a success. Thank you all so much for joining us and for giving so generously to this very worthwhile cause.



Rev. Liz Henderson MA BD Mth

Rev. Liz Henderson is currently the minister of Richmond Craigmillar Church, which is situated in a deprived area of Edinburgh. Educated at Laurel Bank School in Glasgow she went on to study Mathematics in Aberdeen University and then Theology at Edinburgh University. From 2005 until 2014 Liz was a presenter of Radio Scotland's "Thought for the Day" programme. She was moderator of Edinburgh Presbytery in 2012 and appointed as a chaplain-in-ordinary to her Majesty the Queen in April 2018. Liz is married to the Rev'd Dr. Jim Jack and they live in Duddingston.

Weeks into her role as minister of Richmond Craigmiller Church, Liz visited Jessie Douglas, a local resident, because her son had been killed in a motorbike accident the night before. He was 28.

In the following year, there were fifteen young people who died in the community, leaving thirty-four children bereaved of a father, mother or sibling. Liz conducted the funerals of each of these young people and provided pastoral support to some of the families. During this time, she and Jessie became aware of the impact that grief was having on the children and realised that the children needed far more support than they could, or was being, offered.


Statistics have shown that young bereaved people are more likely to self-harm, to complete suicide and to experience depression or anxiety. They are more likely to suffer from physical illness without the relevant help and the chance of grief clouding their adult life is shown in the terrifying statistic of 90% of the inmates at Polmont Young Offenders in Scotland suffering significant bereavement in childhood.

Plans were made, funds were raised and Richmond's Hope was opened in 2003. A skilled team was put together and since the opening they have provided individual support for over 3,000 children and are the leading provider of support for bereaved children in Scotland.

Cath founded Cath Kidston Ltd in 1993 in a small store in London's Notting Hill with a start-up budget of just £15,000. From her original 'home store' concept she built and developed the business into the influential and highly recognisable global brand it is today, with more than 220 stores worldwide and a global e-commerce business.

Prior to starting Cath Kidston, Cath co-founded the interior design and 'curtinalia' company McKinney Kidston in a store off the King's Road in Chelsea (1988-1993) having previously trained in interior design under the celebrated decorator Nicholas Haslam (1985-1988).

Cath remained Creative Director of Cath Kidston Ltd until December 2014, when she moved to a non-executive board role; a role she left in February 2016 when the business was valued at £250m.

In 2010 Cath was awarded an MBE for series to Business; she is now a trustee of the charity Fine Cell Work, mentors start-ups and runs a new independent design studio, Joy of Print.

Dame Penelope Keith DBE, DL Actress & Gardener

Penelope Keith trained for the stage at the Weber Douglas Academy, then worked in repertory at Chesterfield, Lincoln, Manchester & Salisbury.

She joined the Royal Shakespeare Company for seasons at Stratford-upon-Avon and the Aldwych Theatre, London.

She has appeared in many plays in the West End and throughout the United Kingdom.

Her television appearances include The Good Life, To the Manor Born and more recently Hidden Villages and Coastal Villages.

She is President of the Actors' Benevolent Fund and was High Sheriff of Surrey in 2002-2003.

She was appointed Dame Commander of the British Empire in the New Year Honours in 2014.

Eleanor Argyll

Eleanor runs Inveraray Castle and Gardens in Argyll with her husband Torquhil. Eleanor is also Chairman of the Historic Houses Tourism Committee, President of the Georgian Group and proud Patron of Richmond's Hope. They have three children Archie, Rory & Charlotte. Previously Eleanor worked for Charles Barker Public Relations and Weber Shandwick.



Elisabeth Beccle


