There is still more to do, and events like today are incredibly important in raising the vital funds needed to deliver this wonderful service in Edinburgh. Every penny donated will go directly to helping vulnerable women in Scotland go on and be the best they can be.

I do hope you have an enjoyable event.



Christine lives in Edinburgh with her three children who are in full time education.





Prue Leith, CBE Novelist, TV Presenter, Restaurateur & Businesswoman

Prue Leith founded the Leith's group including Leith's School of Food and Wine, the Michelin Star restaurant, Leith's, and a catering company with contracts for the Orient Express Train, the Queen Elizabeth II Conference Centre and the Edinburgh International Conference Centre, in total employing 500 people. She has been Chair of the environmental charity, Forum for the Future, the RSA, Ashridge Management College, 3E's Enterprises (a not-for profit turning round failing schools) and the School Food Trust, tasked with the reform of school catering. She chaired Focus on Food, the Soil Association's partner in the Food for Life initiative in schools, and has been a board member of British Rail, Safeway, Halifax, Whitbread, Woolworths, Omega and Belmond Hotels. A prolific food writer, she has also published a memoir, Relish, and seven novels. She is busy writing the third book in the Food of Love trilogy. She is Chancellor of Queen Margaret University and is a judge on the Great British Bake Off.

Guest Speaker



Tracy Edwards, MBE
Round the World Sailor
& Founder of The Maiden Factor

Tracy shot to fame when she skippered the first all-female crew in the 1989/90 Whitbread Round the World Race. In 1990 Tracy was awarded the MBE and wrote "Maiden" (Whitbread Sports Book of the Year). In 1998 Tracy put together the first all-female crew to attempt the fastest non-stop circumnavigation by sail. Her 92 foot catamaran broke five world records. "Living Every Second" was published in 2001. She retired from sailing in 2005 and worked for CEOP (Child Exploitation and Online Protection) as Project Manager for their International Youth Advisory Conference. During 2009 - 2012 she studied at Roehampton University and graduated with a Degree in Psychology.

In 2011 Maiden was found rotting in the Seychelles and in 2014, Tracy began raising funds in order to rescue Maiden and bring her home to the UK. The Maiden Factor has been set up to promote and fundraise for the education of 65 million girls worldwide who are currently denied this basic right. Once restored to her former glory, Maiden, an iconic piece of British Maritime History, will embark on a three-year world tour to raise funds for the charity Maiden Education. Maiden Education funds projects run by charities who enable and facilitate girls' education.

Tracy has joined forces with the daughter of HM King Hussein I. HRH Princess Haya Bint Al Hussein is passionate about the education of girls and is generously providing support for The Maiden Factor.

The Duchess of Argyll

Eleanor runs Inveraray Castle and Gardens in Argyll with her husband Torquhil. The Castle is open to the public from April to October and is one of the more popular tourist attractions in Scotland as well as being used for the Downton Abbey Christmas Special. Eleanor started the 'Best of the West Festival' at the Castle in 2010, a weekend of the West of Scotland's finest food, whisky, ale, music, crafts and children's entertainment. They have three children Archie, Rory and Charlotte. Previously Eleanor worked for Charles Barker Public Relations and Weber Shandwick.



Mrs Richard Beccle

Elisabeth is married to Richard, has two children aged 18 and 16 and lives in Oxfordshire. She is a non-executive director of four investment trusts and a trustee of the New Entrepreneurs Foundation. From 1992 until 2008 she lived in Hong Kong, where she worked for Schroders. She began her investment career in Edinburgh and was brought up in Stirlingshire.



Lady Colquhoun

Kate is the Principal of two schools in South West London. She founded Broomwood Hall in 1984 with 12 pupils and followed this by establishing a boys' Prep school, Northcote Lodge, in 1993. After Edinburgh University, Francine worked in the City for 10 years before having children. Since then she has been working part-time in various capacities, most recently as COO of a small hedge-fund and she is currently working in a family office. The Women Achievement Luncheon has been raising funds for Scottish charities for ten years. The first committee was formed in 2007 and the first lunch held at the Caledonian Club in 2008. In those nine years the Lunch has raised around £245.000 for various Scottish Charities.

Over the years the lunch has given support to Scottish National Treasures, protecting endangered species, the Prince's Trust and helping a wide range of Scottish people with education, training and opening opportunities.

Last year we supported The Teapot Trust providing hospital based art therapy to children with chronic illness and raised around £18,000 to help, including a special project helping children directly affected by the Grenfell Tower fire.

This year we are supporting Smart Works, Edinburgh, part of a national charity that provides clothes and mentoring to women getting back into work.

One of their art therapists was already based in the Chelsea & Westminster Hospital where she was on hand to work directly with the children, many of whom had lost their immediate family and seen the horrors of the fire unfolding. Thanks to your generosity they were able to pay her to co-ordinate the art therapy for children affected by the fire over the school summer holidays and to offer supervision to the therapists working in the community centre until the Community could take over and school started again.

The rest of the money was spent on Ward 4 in the Royal Hospital for Children, Glasgow, in the National Psychiatric in-patient unit for children under twelve. The Teapot Trust provides art therapy on a weekly basis to children who are resident in the hospital for months at a time due to their complicated psychiatric needs. These children have benefitted hugely from having one-to-one art therapy on their ward.

Richmond's Hope was founded in 2003 in a deprived area of Edinburgh with the aim of providing dedicated bereavement support for children and their families. They were the first to provide such support in Scotland and are still regarded as the leading provider of support for bereaved children in Scotland.


Since then Richmond's Hope have provided individual support for 3,000 children and in 2016 opened a new service in Glasgow.

Research (by the Child Bereavement Trust) says that one in every twenty nine children between the ages of 5 and 16 have been bereaved of a parent or a sibling and studies have shown that about one in three of these children will be nefit from a service such as ours.

The percentage of prisoners who have suffered a significant bereavement in childhood at Polmont Young Offenders Institute is 90% and Richmond's Hope works to help children to grieve in such a way that their bereavement doesn't cloud their life as an adult.
